Conquering the savage mountain.

K2 isn't nicknamed "the savage mountain" for nothing. The world's second-highest peak is arguably the toughest challenge in mountaineering, with one of the worst fatality rates of all the 8,000ers. For a long time, it was considered unconquerable, because of its great height, almost unbroken slopes of rock and ice, and precipitous overhangs. Despite multiple attempts, no-one had climbed it in winter until January 2021, when our leaders Nimsdai, Mingma David and Mingma Tenzi stood on its majestic, 8,611m-high peak.

K2 Expedition

Our leaders Nimsdai, Mingma David, and Mingma Tenzi will be forever associated with K2 because of their world-first winter ascent in January 2021. But they have a history with the world's second-highest mountain that stretches back before that remarkable feat. Mingma David led the rope-fixing team on K2 twice, leading to successful summits both times. And of course, Nimsdai summited the savage mountain as part of his 'Project Possible' push in 2019, when many people told him it wasn't - around 90 percent of the expeditions turned round that year without making it to the top.

Our leader's success on mountains like K2 is about more than just their supreme skill as climbers - it comes down to their ability to plan and prepare for every eventuality that can possibly be prepared for. This approach has become one of Elite Exped's founding principles: we control the controllable, making sure we keep every aspect of expedition planning, from preparing food to fixing ropes, in-house, so we're never left relying on third parties.

This helps ensure the best chances of summit success for our clients, but perhaps more importantly, it also helps us maintain the highest safety standards. We guarantee a 1:1 guide to client ratio on all our expeditions, with four guides always kept in reserve in case of emergencies.

Like our directors Nimsdai, Mingma David and Mingma Tenzi, all of our guides are hugely experienced mountaineers, and many of them are record-holders in their own right. They're also trained in high altitude rescue and recovery techniques. We have evacuation plans and accessible helicopter rescue in place, ready to go at short notice should it be needed. Simply put, if you're thinking of attempting one of the world's hardest mountains, you could not be in safer hands.

Climbing K2 is a huge achievement and the pinnacle of any mountaineers' career. It's not easy, but that's the point. As record-breakers, we recognize and respect the desire to achieve the impossible in our clients - it's what drives us too. If it's your dream to conquer the savage mountain as we have previously, we'll stand with you, and climb with you, every step of the way.

Payment

You may pay your deposit and balance using any lawful means. If sending money by electronic bank transfer then you will be responsible for covering the cost of the fees associated with the transfer, so that the company receives the full amount shown on your invoice, in the denomination shown on your invoice.

Cancellation

NB: There will be no refund of the deposit, as this policy will protect members who have committed their time and money to the expedition. It is advised to take out third-party travel cancellation insurance if you wish to be covered.

- Full payment must be made 120 before the expedition date. The following cancellations charges will apply, if you decide to cancel the booking:
- Deposits are non-refundable. Cancellations made 120 days prior to the departure date, will incur a loss of 30 percent of the total trip cost. Cancellations made 90 days prior to the departure date will incur a loss of 50 percent of the trip cost. Cancellations made 60 days prior to the departure date, will incur a loss of 70 percent of the total trip cost. Cancellations made 30 days or less to the departure date will incur a loss of 100 percent of the total trip cost.
- All refund requests must be made in writing and be received in our office within the 60-120 days period, as stated above.

NB: All refund requests must be made in writing and be received in our office within the notice period stated above.

For all cancellations, the company must be notified in writing. Acceptable means of communication include letter and email.

Insurance

All Elite Exped clients require appropriate insurance for their chosen expedition. Please ensure your policy covers helicopter and medical rescue and repatriation costs.

Elite Exped's has a long-standing operational partnership with [Global Rescue](#), the world's leading membership organisation providing medical security, travel risk and crisis response services to travellers worldwide. Because of our history of operating side-by-side with Global Rescue, we recommend our clients register with them by preference.

Our close working relationship helps smooth the process of any potential rescue, saving valuable time that can affect the outcome. Memberships start at US\$119, and without a Global Rescue membership, an emergency evacuation could cost you more than US\$100,000.
